## This is Not Walking in Truth

Now, reflect on these 8 verses that teach us how we are NOT to walk.

Holding on to anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication, lying to one another (Col 3.8-9)

*Walking in the vanity of mind, with the understanding darkened, ignorant of God, having a blind heart, being lascivious, uncleanness and greedy (Eph 4.17-19)*

Lying (Eph 4.25)

*Speaking corruptly (Eph 4.29)*

Practicing fornication, all uncleanness, covetousness, filthiness, foolish talking, jesting, no immoral or impure person, covetous man who is an idolater (Eph 5.3-6)

*Practicing immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry (Col 3.5)*

Being drunk with wine in excess (Eph 5.18)

*Holding on to bitterness, wrath, anger, clamour, evil speaking, malice {clamour means big words, loud threatenings and hurtful words that cause bitterness, wrath and anger} {evil speaking means all railing, reviling, reproachful speeches} {malice means rooted anger which leads to plans to do mischief to others} (Eph 4.31)*

## What is Walking in Truth?

Walking in truth is obeying God's Word which includes reading it, studying it and most of all, doing it.

James said in his book, "be ye doers of the Word, and not hearers only..." James 1:21 KJV

So, simply put, do your best to be Christ-like in your words, deeds and responses.

## Why Should You Walk in Truth?

Ephesians and Colossians teach the importance of "walk worthy" or "walk in the Lord" that need to be further examined. To do this, we need to go to where it all began and that is with the commandments.

There are many references to Old Testament verses that speak of walking in truth. Here's one to look at, "walk in all the ways which the Lord your God commanded you," Deuteronomy 5:33. This verse mentions a promise. It says that *if we keep the commands, we may live a long life.*

Other verses in Deuteronomy remind us to "walk in his ways" and to "fear him". (Deuteronomy 8:6; 10:12-13) This reference to "fear" does not mean to be afraid but to have reverence for God.

Deuteronomy 10:12-13 also mentions to "serve him" and to "keep his commands and statutes". While we are no longer under the Law of the Old Testament, we are under the Law of Grace of the New Testament.

The Law of Grace is summed up in Mark 12:30-31 when Jesus said

*And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment*



## What Walking in Truth Means

Here are 22 verses on what walking in truth is.

Walk in the light; have fellowship with other believers (1 John 1.7)

*Abide in Him, walk as He walked (1 John 2.6)*

Walk in truth and in the commandments (2 John 4, 6)

*Walk and please God; walk honestly (1 Thess 4.1-12)*

Speak truth (Eph 4.25)

*Be followers of God; walk in love (Eph 5.1-2)*

Walk in love; walk in the light; walk carefully (Eph 5:1-15)

*Be filled with the Spirit; giving thanks (Eph 5.18-20)*

Stand fast in the faith, act properly, be strong, be loving (1 Cor 16.13-14)

*The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (Gal 5.22-23)*

Bear one another's burdens (Gal 6.2)

*Be renewed in the Spirit of your mind and put on the new man (Eph 4.23-24)*

Be angry but don't sin (Eph 4.26)

*Speak words to edify and give grace (Eph 4.29)*

Do not grieve the Holy Spirit (Eph 4.30)

*Be kind, tenderhearted, forgiving one another (Eph 4.32)*

Be filled with the fruit of righteousness (Phil 1.11)

*Let your conversation please the Gospel (Phil 1.27)*

Do all things without murmuring or disputes (Phil 2.14)

*Be blameless and harmless (Phil 2.15)*

Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, with thanksgiving (Col 3.17)

We walk in the flesh but do not war in the flesh but practice self-control and know who the real enemy is (2 Cor 10.3-6)
